North Shore Gymnasts Wow Judges at Judges Cup Competition

51 North Shore Athletes Competed and Won Top Awards

SEPTEMBER 23, 2024 – Athletes from North Shore Gymnastics Association (NSGA) had a promising start to the fall competition season this weekend at the annual Judges Cup meet at North St. Paul High School.

North Shore Gymnasts competed at Level 3, Level 4 and Xcel Silver on Sunday, September 22, 2024. The athletes put on an impressive performance for the judges and earned several top placements.

Kicking off the competition, NSGA Xcel Silver athletes' strong routines contributed to impressive results taking second place among the competing Xcel Silver teams. In the A division, Eleanor Wagner (Mound) won first place All Around with four spots on the podium placing first place Floor, second place Beam, third place Vault and fourth place Uneven Bars. Cygni Corradi (Mound) earned second place All Around with three spots on the podium placing first on Beam and Vault, and fourth place on Floor. Reese Moslander (Minnestrista) took second place on Floor along with fourth place on Beam and All Around. Elowyn Stofferahn (Orono) placed second in both Vault and Uneven

Bars. In the Silver B division Grace Barsness (Medina) earned third place on Floor, fourth place on Beam and fifth All Around. The C division girls had great results as well. Elise Marcouiller (Maple Plain) placed first on Beam, third on Floor and Vault and third All Around. Cora Wegleitner (Hamel) placed first on Floor and fourth on Vault.

Level 3 gymnasts continued to see medal success and took home a lot of hard-earned hardware. Leading off with division A, Jenna Matson (Mayer) won first on Beam and floor and second on Uneven Bars and Vault, leading her to take first place All Around. Hadley Hannay (Maple Plain) earned second on Beam and third place on Floor and All Around. Brooklyn McCoy (Independence) medaled third on Beam and fifth on Vault and All Around. Amilia Lund (Wayzata) placed third on Uneven Bars and fourth on Vault and Taylor Merz (Orono) placed fourth on Floor. Division B's Sloane Svobodny (Mound) took home third place All Around with a third place medal on Beam and fourth place medal on Uneven Bars. Joey Wood (Independence) took fifth on both Beam and Floor and Tenley Marcotte (Maple Grove) took home the third place medal for Floor. The C session athletes had an impressive lineup leading the podium. Kendall Matson (Mayer) won first place All Around with first place medals on Uneven Bars, Beam and Floor and fourth place on Vault. Vailynn Jahnke (Mound) came in third All Around as well on both Vault and Beam and fourth on Uneven Bars. Gracelyn LePage (Buffalo) medaled third on Uneven Bars and fifth on Beam while Aria Eng (Minnestrista) took home the fifth place medal on Uneven Bars and Maya Kucera (Long Lake) placed fifth on Floor. Patty Peterson (Mound) finished strong in the D division with second All Around, third on Uneven Bars and fourth on Beam. Maddie Weinberg (Watertown) placed second on

Beam, third All Around and fifth on Uneven Bars. Briana Figueiredo (Medina) placed second on Vault and Lydia Emery (Brooklyn Park) placed fifth on Vault.

The Level 4 athletes gave a strong performance to wrap up the competition day. In session A, Ruby Kate Martin (Long Lake) had an impressive second place win on Vault and third on Beam and Chachi Denniston (Maple Plain) placed fifth on Beam. Gemma Johnski (Minnetrista) had a fifth place finish on Beam and Floor and Kate Snaza (Mound) placed fifth on Vault during session B. The Session C athletes medaled as well. Hadley Louricas (Wayzata) had a third place performance on Floor and placed fifth on both Beam and All Around. Session D gymnasts led the podium lineup with Alice Fogle (Corcoran) taking home first place All Around with a first place performance on both Floor and Vault, second place on Beam and fifth place on Uneven Bars. Beatrice Parks (Long Lake) finished second overall with a first place medal on Uneven Bars, and second place medals for both Vault and Floor. Louise Parks (Long Lake) was third All Around with a second place medal on Uneven Bars and fourth place on both Beam and Floor. Alexis Pohl (Corcoran) placed fourth on Uneven Bars and fifth on Vault and All Around.

The next competition will be the Go for Gold Invite on September 28-29 at Mariner Middle School in White Bear Lake.
